Below you will find the table display application. **Please note: application deadline has been extended to May 1, 2016**. Applicants will be notified of decisions by May 9<sup>th</sup>.

Accepted applicants will be asked to attend the July 12<sup>th</sup> event (9am-1pm) and prepare materials to share with other providers, DBHIDS staff and other attendees. Materials may be in the form of brochures, handouts, or posters.

- The materials you prepare should include information about:
  - The EBP you are featuring.
  - The target population and referral process.
  - Outcomes of the program (either based on research evidence or your collection of outcome data).
  - Key features of the EBP (e.g. specific skills, coaching strategies, or interventions that are part of the EBP).
  - Examples of how this treatment has helped individuals and families receiving services.
  - How you would tell someone who is seeking services about the EBP and the benefits of this treatment.

We are inviting any organization delivering an evidence-based practice to submit an application for review.

For this event, we will be featuring:

1. Evidence-based practices that have been evaluated through rigorous research (e.g. practices recognized on an EBP registry like: National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices <http://www.nrepp.samhsa.gov/>).

**Or**

2. Practices that have been evaluated at your program (practice-based evidence) and that have shown positive outcomes on data you have collected (e.g. improved functioning at home, work or school, symptom reduction in mental health, reduction in substance use, increased engagement in community, reductions in recidivism in juvenile justice, safety or permanency in child welfare).

  - d) Anything else that may be helpful in understanding your quality assurance practices
