OPIOID USE DISORDER AFFECTS MILLIONS

More than **2.5 million** Americans suffer from opioid use disorder.

Philadelphia had **1,150 overdose deaths in 2019, 963 with opioids detected.**

Use of opioids, including heroin and prescription pain relievers, can; **1)** lead to babies being born dependent, as well as **2)** spread of infectious diseases like HIV and hepatitis.

- Medications can help treat opioid use disorder
- Research supports the effectiveness of medication as part of a comprehensive treatment plan for people with opioid use disorder

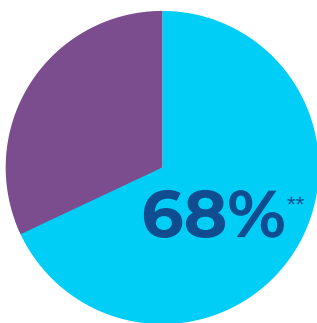

MEDICATION-ASSISTED TREATMENT IS THE GOLD STANDARD OF CARE

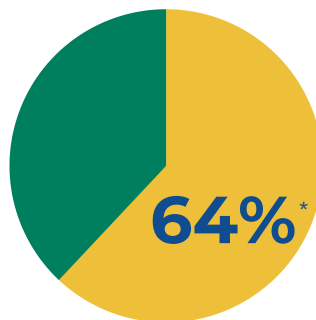
Including a medication as part of treatment decreases opioid-overdose deaths, opioid use, and infectious disease transmission.

Community Behavioral Health (CBH) in-network programs offer MAT

**Nationally, only 23% of publicly-funded facilities offer MAT.



CBH members **diagnosed** with opioid use disorder participate in MAT

*Nationally, only 40% of opioid-dependent individuals receive MAT.
