DBHIDS is a department under the City of Philadelphia's Health and Human Services cabinet.

Our department functions as a single-payer public health system using federal, state, and local dollars, including Medicaid, to oversee:

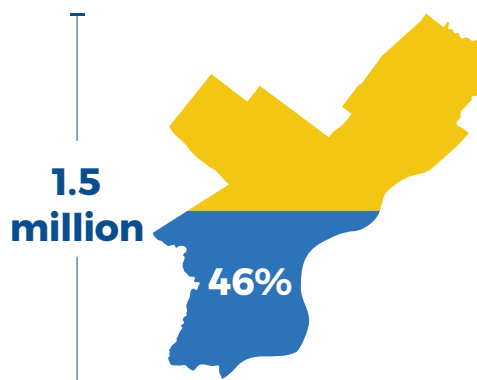
- Behavioral health care

We have built a single, integrated system that empowers a network of providers, partners, and community members to help create a Philadelphia where every resident can thrive.

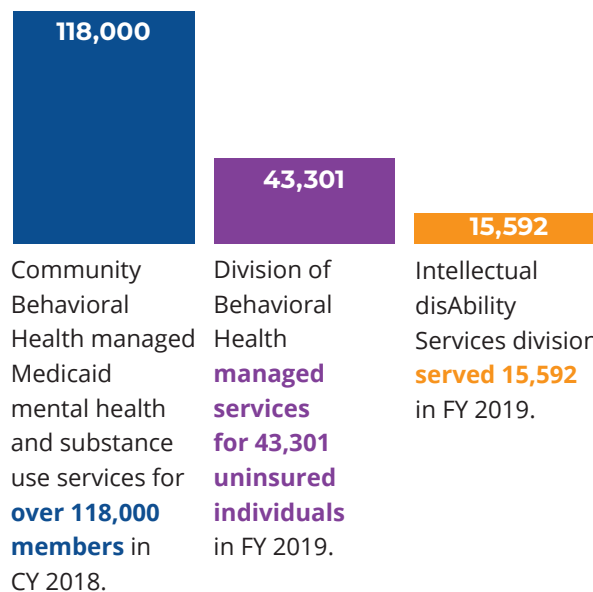
DBHIDS is composed of seven divisions that oversee services for children, adults, and families.

## IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

Of the **1.5 million** Philadelphians, nearly **718,000** are eligible for Medicaid. This equals **46%** of the population.



DBHIDS directly serves over **170,000** individuals annually.



DBHIDS generates cost savings and economic impact for Philadelphia.

Every \$1 spent by DBHIDS results in an additional \$2.50 in economic activity.
